





CONTACT INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS

It is very important that the school has accurate and current information regarding a student's address and telephone number. This information is used for contacting parents regarding student progress, as well as other issues that arise during the day. It also is used by our ParentSquare system to inform you of school closing, delay or emergency. Please contact the Central and/or phone number changes during the school year. Phone numbers also can be changed via the Parent Portal.







Closings & Delays/Community Use of Facilities

School Closings and Delays

In the event of inclement weather or other emergencies, families will be notified by telephone through our ParentSquare emergency notification system.

It is important that the schools always have updated telephone information for families. Delays and closings will be announced on local television and radio stations, the district's Facebook page and on our website – *www.hornellcityschools.com*.

- Two-Hour Delay: If a two-hour delay is announced, your child's school will begin its program two hours later than its regular schedule. School will dismiss at its usual time unless other weather or emergency issues occur. There will be a modified breakfast. Buses will run on a two-hour delay (a.m. only).
- The Hornell City School District is closed: If this is announced, all school buildings will be closed for the entire day. Afterschool and evening activities are normally canceled, too. If after-school and evening activities will occur as scheduled, it will be specifically announced.



Community Use of School Facilities

School facilities may be used by district residents for non-exclusive activities that are educational, cultural, social, recreational or civic in nature, primarily for the benefit of district residents and other approved groups, and consistent with all applicable state laws. Any such use, however, shall not be deemed an endorsement of the activity or the purpose for which the facilities are used.

The superintendent shall prescribe regulations for the use of any school facility. The superintendent shall designate the school business executive to schedule the use of school facilities, ensure that economical and efficient use is made of the time and space available, and issue permits. School groups will normally take precedence over outside groups.

In addition to compliance with all applicable state laws, the regulations:

- Assure the protection of school property.
- Provide for the health and safety of all people involved in the activity.
- Establish guidelines to determine when a fee should be charged for an activity or the use of a school facility.
- Provide fee schedules for when the use of a facility is to be charged to the user.
- Require payment for any damage or loss, whether or not a fee for use has been charged.
- Require that the user maintain adequate insurance to protect the district.

The superintendent has the right to request the following information when an application is submitted: constitution of the organization, by-laws currently in effect, names of officers and list of members.

The complete Community Use of School Facilities Policy is available in the school district offices. You may obtain further information on facility use, or the application forms, from the receptionist in the Central Offices at 120 Raider Road.

Board of Education

Public Participation at Board Meetings:

The Board of Education meets in the High School Library, 134 Seneca Street. Meeting dates and times are listed on this calendar.

Each regular meeting of the Board of Education shall provide an opportunity for members of the public to address agenda items and/or address the Board of Education. However, matters which MAY NOT be addressed by the public in an open session of the meeting of the Board of Education are as follows:

- 1. Matters which will imperil the public safety if disclosed;
- 2. Any matter which may disclose the identity of a law enforcement agent or informer;
- Information relating to current or future investigation or prosecution of criminal offense, which would imperil effective law enforcement if disclosed:
- 4. Discussions regarding proposed, pending or current litigation;
- Collective negotiations pursuant to Article 14 of the current Civil Service Law (the Taylor Law): the medical, financial, credit or employment history of a particular

person or the appointment, employment, promotion, demotion, discipline, suspension, dismissal or removal of a particular person or corporation;

- 6. The preparation, grading or administration of examinations:
- 7. The proposed acquisition, sale or lease of real property or the proposed acquisition of securities, or sale or exchange of securities, but only when publicity would substantially affect the value thereof:
- 8. Discussions concerning probable cause to bring disciplinary charges against a tenured teacher or administrator, and;
- Discussions concerning the evaluation and/or placement of students with disabilities.

For the purpose of efficiently conducting business, the board president may limit the amount of time each member of the public may address the board and/or otherwise restrict the number of members of the public who may speak at any particular meeting.
